Frequently Asked Questions...

1. Can we bring stools to sit on as long as we don't block passageways?

YES - Stools are fine. Most floors are stone or tile, rooms are typically carpeted.

2. Are there restrictions on art supplies?

Pencils, pens, and watercolors are fine, but not dip pens and open bottles or any permanent liquid (ink should be in cartridges) or paste. 80% of the floors open to us are stone, marble or glazed tile. The third floor (where we will start) has rooms that are carpeted and there may be other areas people might want to work.

3. Can we bring food, snacks, or drinks to consume in the Capitol?

We should use Room 316 as our gathering room, a place to leave jackets, and supplies. For a lunch break many people use the Rathskeller in the Basement for light food breaks. We could also use Room 316 as a space for taking a light snack. Any snacking or drink breaks should have all crumbs and debris picked up. Bring napkins to clean surfaces. Bottled water is recommended as the beverage of choice in any carpeted areas.
